About the J. Roger Glunt Graduate Fellowship in Residential Building Construction

The purpose of this fellowship is to recognize and provide financial assistance to graduate students who are already involved in or plan to perform research in housing and residential building construction. This fellowship began in 2006 in honor of J. Roger Glunt, past President of the National Association of Homebuilders.

Eligibility Requirements

This is an award for **full-time graduate students** enrolled or planning to enroll in the **College of Engineering** at Penn State University.

Eligible applicants are expected to manifest promise of academic achievement, demonstrate qualities of leadership, perseverance, and dependability, in addition to demonstrating a specific and proven interest and commitment to the U.S. residential construction industry.

Application Process

The J. Roger Glunt Graduate Fellowship in Residential Construction has both a written application process and an in-person interview component.

Step 1 - Written Application

The following written application materials are due to Rachel Fawcett by email (<u>rfawcett@engr.psu.edu</u>) no later than **Friday**, **February 9, 2018.** Incomplete applications will not be considered. Submission instructions include:

- PDF file format
- One combined file in the order listed below

Required application materials include:

- 1) Completed Application (Page 2)
- 2) an "Unofficial Academic Transcript"
- 3) an "Academic Course Plan" for the applicant's graduate program at Penn State
- 4) a 1-page description of activities or experiences that demonstrate the applicant's leadership, perseverance, and dependability qualities
- 5) a 1-page description of the applicant's knowledge of the U.S. housing industry with regard to the current state, economic and social benefits, as well as the challenges facing the housing industry, *and*
- 6) a 2-page typewritten statement of "Career Objectives" (both short- and longer-term) and your interest in and connection with the U.S. housing industry or houses (see details on Page 2), including how your current university studies connect to and/or influence the U.S. residential construction industry.

Step 2 - In-Person Interview

Selected applicants will be invited for a **10-15 minute interview by the J. Roger Glunt Fellowship Committee for the afternoon of Monday, March 26, 2018**. Committee members include J. Roger Glunt, the CEO of the National Housing Endowment, and the CEO of the Pennsylvania Builders Association. Applicants will be asked questions regarding their interest in the U.S. residential construction industry and what impact they would like to make in the industry.

Applicants will be notified about their interview selection status by Monday, March 12, 2018.
